ARTICLE 1 – Purpose of the Regulations

1. These Regulations – adopted pursuant to Article 11, paragraph 2, of Law no. 341/1990 and Article 12 of Ministerial Decree no. 270/2004 – govern the academic organisation of the Master's Degree Programme in *International Relations and Organisations*, in compliance with the Statute of the University of Campania "Luigi Vanvitelli" (hereinafter also referred to as the University), the General University Regulations, University Academic Regulations, the University Framework Regulations for Departments, and the Departmental Regulations governing the final examination and graduation session, for all matters not defined therein.
2. The Department Board reserves the right to further detail specific aspects of the academic organisation through dedicated regulations.

ARTICLE 2 – General information on the Master's Degree Programme

1. The Master's Degree Programme in *International Relations and Organisations*, Class LM-52 in International Relations, is established and activated at the University of Campania "Luigi Vanvitelli", in

accordance with the provisions set forth by Ministerial Decree of 16 March 2007 and Ministerial Decree of 26 July 2007.

2. The reference academic structure for the Master's Degree Programme is the Department of Political Science.

3. The competent body is the Master's Programme Board in *International Relations and Organisations*, hereinafter referred to as MPB.

4. The premises for academic activities and laboratories are located at the Department of Political Science (Viale Ellittico, n. 31, Caserta), without prejudice to the possibility that specific courses may be held at other structures of the University.

5. The Master's Degree Programme is delivered in mixed mode, combining in-person and distance learning.

ARTICLE 3 – Specific educational objectives and intended learning outcomes

1. The specific objective of the Master's Degree Programme is the training of highly qualified professionals possessing advanced knowledge and interdisciplinary/multidisciplinary skills necessary for the understanding and critical analysis of historical, political, legal, economic, and social phenomena related to the international situation, past and present. Characterised by an increasing degree of systemic complexity, the Master's Programme enables graduates to operate in international and national contexts increasingly oriented towards the internationalisation of relations between state and non-state actors.

2. The Master's Degree Programme in *International Relations and Organisations* is articulated into two study pathways – as detailed in the *Course Prospectus* – one in Italian (*Relazioni e Organizzazioni Internazionali*) and the other in English (*International Relations and Organisations*). The Italian path, after a common first year, provides the possibility to choose, in the second year, between two distinct specialised curricula: the "Human Security and Migration" curriculum aims to provide students with methodological and practical knowledge and skills to analyse and manage the complexity of migratory phenomena autonomously and critically; the "Global System and European Space" curriculum aims to develop theoretical and applied knowledge and skills to investigate and critically approach problems related to the globalisation process and its effects on the European space.

3. The Master's Degree Programme includes several compulsory course units in legal subjects (International Law and Comparative Private Law), historical subjects (Contemporary History and History and Analysis of International Relations), economic subjects (International Political Economy), political science subjects (International Political Relations), sociological subjects, and linguistic subjects (English, French, Spanish, and Arabic). A list of related/supplementary subjects in the legal, economic, political science, and sociological fields is also provided to offer flexible and interdisciplinary training.

4. Curricular and extracurricular activities are intended to impart solid technical-professional skills and verify the students' ability to learn, reflect, elaborate, and exercise independent judgement. To this end, the teaching methodology is based on the principles of active learning, aimed at soliciting student participation and developing public speaking skills through laboratories, exercises, classroom case simulations, and the drafting, presentation, and discussion of documents, projects, and reports. The Study Course is integrated by: seminars and conferences held by The Master's Programme is integrated by: seminars and conferences held by external stakeholders, professional experts and visiting professors; job orientation workshops; and the organisation of team-working activities designed to enhance the theoretical-practical content of the various study paths and stimulate the capacity for interaction in a public context.

5. Students have the opportunity to enrich their cultural and academic background through the Erasmus+ programme and/or through internship/traineeship experiences at entities, companies, institutions, and/or associations, in Italy and abroad.

6. Graduates of the Master's Degree Programme in *International Relations and Organisations* must acquire knowledge of the analytical and evaluative tools relating to the most relevant and current problems hindering the harmonious development of international relations, the solution of which

involves the international community at global and national levels. The acquired knowledge and understanding must allow graduates to develop and/or apply original ideas, including within strategic research and study contexts. The verification of acquired knowledge will be carried out through written and/or oral assessments for individual course units and through the final examination.

7. Graduates must also be able to apply the knowledge and understanding attained from a multidisciplinary perspective, demonstrating the professional skills necessary for identifying problems currently affecting international relations under socio-political and legal-economic profiles.

8. Graduates must have developed an autonomy of judgement that allows them to manage the disciplines explored in the study path with mastery and confidence, as well as to integrate knowledge independently.

9. Graduates must also be able to take positions and develop reconstructions or orientations, even *prima facie*, based on incomplete or non-exhaustive information, as well as to express judgements and evaluations in their sectors of competence.

10. Graduates must know how to communicate their knowledge, as well as their positions and conclusions, clearly and without ambiguity, with full mastery of the technical languages proper to the world of international relations. At the same time, graduates must be able to transmit and explain the political, economic, and legal issues of international relations to non-specialist interlocutors.

11. Graduates must also demonstrate communication skills that allow them to design, promote, and manage awareness, information, and denunciation campaigns in the sectors of international relations at political, legal, and economic levels, addressed both to public opinion and to specific political and economic bodies. Specific seminars and assessments may be organised to improve the level of communication, including in a foreign language, in the various fields of study.

12. For the teaching of English, French, or Spanish, the expected result is to have the student acquire a C1 level of linguistic proficiency.

13. Graduates must be able to correctly apply the methods of internationalist legal-economic and historical-political sciences, managing modern communication and information techniques and multidisciplinary in-depth techniques that allow them a high level of autonomy in finding and critically applying complex data generally referring to foreign systems, international and trans-national contexts, and global processes. To this end, graduates must have achieved mastery of analytical methods and techniques for legal, economic, historical, and political science research.

14. Learning capacity will be acquired through didactic methods and tools that are not limited to traditional lectures and passing intermediate and final tests, but include the preparation and presentation in class of studies, projects, and proposed solutions to specific problems, as well as the preparation of in-depth papers on the topics addressed in the course, possibly adopting a multidisciplinary and transversal approach.

15. The final examination will specifically verify the development of learning skills aimed at facilitating an adequate entry into the world of work.

ARTICLE 4 – Career opportunities

1. The primary career prospects for graduates of the Master's Degree Programme in *International Relations and Organisations*, taking into account the study pathways or curricula offered in the second year, include:

- the United Nations, its specialised agencies, and other UN-related bodies;
- the International Organisation for Migration (IOM);
- the World Trade Organisation (WTO);
- the European Union, including its agencies;
- the Council of Europe;
- Public administrations, with specific reference to those departments managing international relations;
- the diplomatic service;

- regional and local administrations, particularly within the sectors of external relations and communication;
- Prefectures and Territorial Commissions for the Recognition of International Protection;
- public and private entities operating in the field of reception and integration of migrants;
- the political career;
- cultural mediation;
- non-governmental organisations (NGOs), non-profit organisations, and the third sector at international, European, national, and local levels;
- national and multinational companies;
- public and private companies involved in international activities or those aimed at internationalisation;
- consulting firms and entities specialising in public relations and corporate communications;
- national and international study and research centres (think-tanks).

2. The Master's Degree Programme also provides a solid foundation for further advanced studies (PhD, Level II Master's programmes), leading to professions characterised by high-level expertise, including research-based roles.

ARTICLE 5 – Academic activities

1. The Master's Degree Programme in *International Relations and Organisations* is structured to provide training characterised by a multidisciplinary theoretical and applied approach. The Master's Programme is delivered in mixed mode: the proportion of activities conducted via distance learning is established annually by the MPB

2. The Master's Degree Programme aims to train young graduates to become experts in the international, political, legal, and economic sectors. In particular, the Master's Programme's objectives are: - to provide an in-depth study of the development processes of international relations from historical, political, legal, and economic perspectives; - to explore the phenomenon of international organisations and associations, with particular reference to those operating at universal and regional levels; - to provide the skills necessary to analyse and manage issues pertaining to international relations at both bilateral and multilateral levels, as well as to monitor and ensure compliance with legal regulations for the purpose of peaceful coexistence between states, the promotion of intergovernmental cooperation, and sustainable development that respects diverse socio-cultural realities and traditions; - to provide knowledge of macro- and micro-economic phenomena linked to the progressive globalisation of trade and finance; - to provide interdisciplinary research methods and analytical tools necessary for a successful and appropriate entry into the public and private labour markets.

Regarding the Italian study pathway, educational activities are further defined based on the two curricula available in the second year. With respect to the "Human Security and Migration" curriculum, the Master's Programme ensures the acquisition of adequate knowledge and skills: - in the field of migrant and refugee protection, as well as for individuals in need of international protection at international, European, and national levels; - for the critical understanding, conception, design, and management of policies, programmes, and projects related to development cooperation, inclusion, and the integration of migrants and asylum seekers.

With respect to the "Global System and European Space" curriculum, the Master's Programme ensures the acquisition of adequate knowledge and skills: - to analyse and interpret, from a critical perspective, the issues related to globalisation at political, economic, sociological, and legal levels; - for the managerial understanding of European interests and the dynamics characterising the development and international projections of the European space, especially from political, economic, and sociological viewpoints.

3. The general framework of educational activities is defined in the Course Catalogue, which is an integral part of these Regulations. The Course Catalogue specifies the name and list of course units (including elective courses), and the corresponding scientific-disciplinary sectors (SDS);

furthermore, language proficiency requirements and the final examination are indicated. The number of credits (ECTS) assigned is specified for each activity.

4. The MPB approves the Course Catalogue annually by majority vote, which is then published in the *Course Prospectus*.

5. Students may propose an Individual Study Plan to the MPB by October 31st of each year, provided it is consistent with the minimum requirements set forth in the University's Academic Framework. It is also permitted to propose a Study Plan including the acquisition of additional educational credits beyond the minimum number (120 ECTS) required by the Academic Regulations. The MPB evaluates the consistency of the individual Study Plan with the educational objectives and the adequacy of any justification provided.

ARTICLE 6 – Admission requirements and assessment procedures

1. Pursuant to Article 6, paragraph 2 of Ministerial Decree no. 270/04, enrolment in the Master's Degree Programme in *International Relations and Organisations* is subject to meeting specific curricular requirements and the assessment of the adequacy of the student's personal preparation.

2. Curricular requirements are deemed to be satisfied by possessing a degree in classes L-5, L-6, L-10, L-11, L-12, L-14, L-15, L-16, L-18, L-36, L-37, L-39, L-40, L-42, or equivalent qualifications under current legislation. In the absence of a degree in the aforementioned classes, enrolment is contingent upon the following two requirements:

a) a three-year Bachelor's degree, a four-year degree, a Master's degree, or a recognised and eligible foreign qualification;

b) the acquisition of at least 45 ECTS (CFU) in the following groups of scientific-disciplinary sectors (SDS): - at least 6 ECTS in M-STO/04, M-STO/02, SPS/06; - at least 6 ECTS in IUS/13, IUS/14; - at least 6 ECTS in SPS/04, SPS/01, SPS/02, SPS/07; - at least 6 ECTS in SECS-P/01, SECS-P/02. For applicants holding a degree different from those specified and/or who have acquired an insufficient number of ECTS in the prescribed sectors, the possession of curricular requirements will be evaluated by the Teaching Committee of the MPB through an analysis of the academic transcript (*curriculum studiorum*) and, where deemed necessary, an interview.

3. Enrolment in the Master's Degree Programme is further subject to the verification of adequate personal preparation. Students must satisfy the curricular requirements prior to the verification of personal preparation. This assessment is conducted via a test, the procedures and timing of which are specified in the Departmental Regulations governing access to Master's Degree Programmes.

Proficiency in English, French, or Spanish at a level no lower than B2 is required, as evidenced by a language certificate or, in its absence, by one of the following criteria:

a) passing a B2-level university exam in English, French, or Spanish, provided the course syllabus clearly states that this level was achieved;

b) verification by the Teaching Committee of the Master's Programme Board;

c) an undergraduate or graduate degree from a programme taught entirely in English;

d) native speaker status.

Should the personal preparation be deemed insufficient, the student must sit for an oral interview with the Teaching Committee on subjects specifically identified based on the areas where deficiencies have been noted.

4. The Master's Degree Programme in *International Relations and Organisations* is an open-access programme (non-restricted enrolment).

5. The enrolment of non-EU students residing abroad is permitted within the limits established by the University bodies. Enrolment for non-EU students is subject to passing an oral interview (via teleconference if necessary) with the Chair of the Master's Programme, possibly assisted by another professor affiliated with the Programme, and in the presence of the Department's Head of the Didactic Area. The interview will focus on the student's previous education and the rationale for choosing to enrol in the Master's Programme.

ARTICLE 7 – Duration of the Master’s Degree Programme

1. The standard duration of the Master’s Degree Programme in *International Relations and Organisations* is two years. To obtain the degree, students must acquire 120 ECTS.
2. A full-time study workload is expected, conventionally set at 60 ECTS per year.
3. Students may enrol on a part-time study path, pursuant to Article 32 of the University Academic Regulations and Rectoral Decree (D.R.) no. 893/2015. Furthermore, should a student remain inactive for a prolonged period – and in any case, if the degree is not attained within a timeframe equal to triple the standard duration of the Programme – the competent bodies reserve the right to verify the continued validity of the credits acquired.

ARTICLE 8 – Academic organisation and conduct of the study pathways

1. As indicated in the *Course Prospectus*, the Master’s Degree Programme is structured into two study pathways: one in Italian (*Relazioni e Organizzazioni Internazionali*) and one in English (*International Relations and Organisations*). The Italian study pathway, following a common first year, offers the possibility to choose between two distinct specialised curricula in the second year: the “Human Security and Migration” curriculum and the “Global System and European Space” curriculum. Academic activities for each academic year are conducted over two semesters, in compliance with the University’s academic calendar and according to the structure defined in the *Course Prospectus*. The list of course units offered, including their respective scientific-disciplinary sectors (SDS) and any modular structures, is contained in the *Study Plans Regulations* (Annex no. 1 to these Regulations).
2. The academic calendar is established annually by the Department Board, having consulted with the MPB.
3. To ensure the transparency of the academic offering, the course unit descriptions (Syllabi) must specify: the language of instruction, the main contents, reference texts, educational objectives, intended learning outcomes, teaching methods, and assessment methods. The Syllabus for each course unit is published on the Department’s website.
4. In line with the educational objectives of the Master’s Programme, course units are structured according to teaching methodologies designed to promote active learning. This approach aims to enrich the student’s understanding and foster problem-setting and problem-solving skills, including through an experiential approach.
To ensure consistency between the intended learning outcomes (Dublin Descriptors) and the educational activities (course units, laboratories, internships, etc.) that characterise the Master’s Degree Programme, the Tuning Matrix is attached to these Regulations (Annex no. 2).
5. Upon completion of the study path, the student shall sit for a final examination, according to the procedures set forth in Article 10 of these Regulations.
6. The technical specifications for the delivery of distance learning activities are defined annually by the MPB in accordance with Departmental and University directives.
7. Public access to class schedules, examination dates, graduation sessions, and faculty office hours is guaranteed through publication on the Department’s website.
8. The Master’s Degree Programme in International Relations and Organisations may, where the opportunity arises, organise learning activities in collaboration with foreign or public or private institutions. Such activities must be individually approved by the MPB and conducted under the academic responsibility of a professor of the Study Programme. The ECTS credits assigned to these activities shall be deliberated by the MPB.
9. Within the framework of increasing integration with Italian and foreign universities or other institutions of comparable cultural significance, it is possible to substitute educational activities (course units or other) provided for in the Master’s Degree Programme with others conducted at Italian or foreign universities, or to recognise, individually or in blocks, educational activities delivered at such institutions. This shall take place within the framework of international agreements and programmes, inter-university agreements, or specific memoranda of understanding

proposed by the MPB, approved by the Department Board, and deliberated, where necessary, by the competent University academic body.

ARTICLE 9 – Assessment of learning outcomes

1. A specific number of ECTS credits is assigned to each educational activity. One ECTS credit corresponds to 25 hours of work, consisting of 6 hours (lectures, seminars, or similar activities) and 19 hours dedicated to independent study or other individual learning activities.
2. Each educational activity is subject to an assessment of learning outcomes; upon successful completion, the student is awarded the corresponding ECTS credits.
3. During the assessment, the professors shall verify the student's knowledge, understanding, autonomy of judgement, communication skills, and learning capacity.
4. Assessments are conducted according to methods defined by the individual professors responsible for the course units, within the framework established by the MPB. The assessment methods and criteria must be published on the professors' faculty web pages – within the individual Syllabus – and must be published before the start of each academic year.
5. Learning assessments may also include formative self-assessment tests; these carry no weight towards the final exam grade and must be organised so as not to interfere with concurrent educational activities.
6. For periods of study abroad and the corresponding examinations, the recognition of ECTS credits is monitored by the Erasmus Delegate appointed by the Department Board.
7. The procedures for scheduling the examination calendar are established by the Department Board, after consultation with the MPB.
8. The examination calendar, specifying the date and time of each session, is compiled by the Department's Academic Office, having consulted the MPB at the beginning of the academic year and taking into account the scheduling of academic activities. The calendar is approved by the Head of Department and is made public with adequate notice.
9. Once published, examination dates cannot be advanced. Should it be necessary to postpone an exam date for a justified reason, the professors must provide timely notice to the students via the website and inform the Department Secretariat for the necessary administrative measures.
10. The examination calendar provides for ordinary and extraordinary sessions, distributed throughout the academic year as follows:
 - Winter session (2 exam calls);
 - Summer session (3 exam calls);
 - Autumn session (3 exam calls);
 - Extraordinary session (2 exam calls).
 - Sessions reserved for students who have exceeded the standard duration of the programme: 1 exam call in the months of November, December, March, April, and May.
11. The interval between two consecutive exam calls for the same course unit must be a minimum of fourteen days.
12. Students may sit for an exam only after registering online via the dedicated system, no later than seven days before the scheduled exam date.
13. Examinations are conducted under the responsibility of an Examination Board appointed by the Head of Department, having consulted the Chair of the MPB. The Boards consist of at least two members and are chaired by the professor responsible for the course unit. Members other than the Chair may include other professors, researchers, or subject matter experts (*cultori della materia*). The title of "subject matter expert" is conferred by the Department Board at the request of the course instructor and is formalized by a decree issued by the Head of Department.
14. Candidates always have the right to withdraw from an assessment. In the case of oral exams, the Board informs the student of the outcome and the evaluation prior to the final record entry; the student may withdraw up until that moment. A withdrawal during an examination does not result in any negative entry on the student's academic transcript or affect the final degree award.

15. The official recording of exam results is performed digitally with the digital signature of the Chair of the Examination Board. Student attendance at the exam call must be recorded in accordance with the procedures of the ESSE3 system.

ARTICLE 10 – Final examination and attainment of the degree

1. The final examination consists of the drafting and discussion – before an Examination Board – of a thesis exhibiting clear elements of originality, focusing on a specific topic related to one of the course units included in the chosen study plan.

2. The final thesis may be prepared in one of the following formats:

a) a “Standard Dissertation” (*elaborato ordinario*), consisting of a reasoned review of bibliographic and documentary sources on a specific theme, to be summarised critically and originally in a written work of no fewer than 90,000 and no more than 200,000 characters (excluding index and bibliography).

b) a “Short Synthetic Dissertation” (*elaborato di compilazione sintetica*), consisting of a concise documentary study – potentially as a development of an internship – based on a critically assimilated bibliography, resulting in a written work of no less than 40,000 and no more than 90,000 characters (excluding index and bibliography).

c) a “Multimedia and/or IT Dissertation”, consisting of a work produced in multimedia format or as a web documentary, potentially interactive, framed within a project that schematically defines the structure, selected criteria, adopted solutions, and presentation objectives, provided that such a work is accompanied by a written presentation of no fewer than 40,000 and no more than 90,000 characters (excluding index).

3. Should the thesis research for a “Standard Dissertation” or a “Multimedia/IT Dissertation” be conducted abroad as part of a mobility programme, it shall be recognised – within the respective Learning Agreement – at a rate of 2 ECTS for each month spent abroad.

4. The final examination is carried out under the responsibility of a Thesis Supervisor (*Relatore*) chosen by the student from among the tenured, substitute, or adjunct professors of the Master’s Degree Programme. Preparation may also be supervised by a subject matter expert delegated by the Supervisor. The Supervisor must be the instructor responsible for the course unit to which the thesis is assigned. Thesis topic assignment may occur at any time, irrespective of the number of ECTS earned or the completion of specific academic activities. Once assigned, the topic remains valid for 24 months. If the work is not completed by this deadline, the assignment may be renewed once for an additional 12 months.

5. In developing the Master’s thesis, the student must demonstrate initiative, conceptual elaboration skills, and the correct application of analytical and synthesis methods acquired throughout the degree programme, as well as autonomy of judgement. The oral discussion shall also evaluate the student’s delivery and clarity of exposition.

6. To obtain the Master’s Degree, the student must have successfully completed all assessments for the educational activities provided in the study plan and earned 120 ECTS, including those for the final examination. 16 ECTS are assigned to the final examination.

7. The final degree grade is determined by adding the final examination score and any bonus points / additional merit points to the weighted average of the exam grades, expressed on a scale of 110. The weighted average refers to the grades obtained in the course unit assessments for the corresponding ECTS. The merit score is awarded primarily based on the quality and originality of the work. For theses in the form of a “Standard” or “Multimedia/IT” dissertation, the maximum score that may be awarded by the Board is 9 points, taking into account the quality of the work and the student’s academic record. For a “Short Synthetic Dissertation,” the maximum score is 6 points.

8. Should the candidate have successfully completed a study period abroad as part of a mobility programme, the following criteria apply: for a six-month period with at least 8 ECTS attained, the candidate is entitled to 1 additional point toward the final grade; for a full-year period with at least 12 ECTS attained, the candidate is entitled to 2 additional points toward the final grade. In the case of certified completion of the language proficiency pathway on Rosetta Stone Catalyst platform, the

Examination Board shall award 2 additional points towards the final degree grade. If the final grade is 110/110, the Board may, by unanimous vote, award Honours (*lode*) and potentially a “Dignity of Print” (*dignità di stampa*) mention.

9. The Departmental Regulations for the final examination and graduation session define the procedures and deadlines for thesis assignment and graduation applications, as well as the rules governing the composition of the Examination Boards and the graduation calendar. For any matters not expressly mentioned, reference is made to the aforementioned Regulations.

ARTICLE 11 – Orientation and Tutoring

1. The Orientation and Tutoring service provides information to support students during admission (incoming orientation) and throughout the course of their studies (ongoing orientation). It offers guidance for the proper progression of the academic career and for exam preparation, aimed at improving educational effectiveness and preventing academic delays.
2. The Orientation and Tutoring service is accessible to all students enrolled in the Programme and is primarily intended for those requiring clarifications or encountering difficulties in passing one or more examinations in their curriculum.
3. A dedicated tutoring service, specifically established by the Department, is provided for students with disabilities and Specific Learning Disabilities (SLD/DSA).
4. The Orientation and Tutoring service operates during the incoming phase to the University, during the course of study, and throughout the duration of studies at the Department (ongoing). Furthermore, the MPB organises events to facilitate networking between the world of work and students, graduates, and doctoral researchers, aimed at promoting awareness of professional or recruitment opportunities and enhancing employability.
5. The Orientation and Tutoring service is administered by a Commission (the Orientation and Tutoring Commission) appointed by the MPB, with the task of assisting students with any issues related to academic activities.

ARTICLE 12 – Prerequisites

1. Sitting for certain examinations may require the prior successful completion of assessments for other course units established as prerequisites.
2. Any prerequisites are approved by the MPB and published on the official institutional website.
3. Failure to comply with prerequisites, where established, shall result in the annulment of the examination taken.

ARTICLE 13 – Attendance requirements

1. The regulations of the Master’s Degree Programme do not stipulate mandatory attendance for students. stipulate compulsory attendance for students.

ARTICLE 14 – International student mobility

1. With a view to enriching the academic offer and promoting the cultural and professional growth of students, the Master’s Programme strongly encourages study periods abroad at partner institutions with which specific agreements have been established (such as Erasmus+ Mobility for Study or Traineeship; inter-university courses; and the awarding of double or multiple degrees).
2. As stated in Article 10 of these Regulations, additional points towards the final degree grade are provided for students who have successfully completed a semester-long study period abroad under a mobility programme. Furthermore, should the thesis research be conducted abroad within a mobility program, it shall be recognised in the corresponding Learning Agreement at a rate of 2 ECTS for each month spent abroad.

ARTICLE 15 – Admission to single course units

1. Admission to attend single course units for one academic year and to sit for the corresponding examinations is permitted for students enrolled at foreign universities, within the framework of international mobility programmes and agreements governed by the principle of reciprocity.
2. Admission to single course units, including the possibility of sitting for the final assessment, is guaranteed for the purpose of cultural or professional development to any interested party, even if not enrolled in any University degree programme.
3. The provisions set forth in the previous paragraph also apply to graduates who wish to attend course units and sit for examinations in disciplines not included in the curricula followed for the attainment of their degree.
4. Admission to single course units is contingent upon the conditions and procedures established by the University Academic Regulations, to which reference is made for all matters not expressly defined herein.

ARTICLE 16 – Recognition of credits and transfers

1. The MPB shall deliberate on credit recognition in cases of transfer from another University, internal transfer within this University, or completion of parts of educational activities at another Italian or foreign University, including through the adoption of an individual study plan.
2. The MPB shall deliberate on enrolment in years subsequent to the first following the recognition of a sufficient number of ECTS, which in any case shall be no fewer than 40.
3. The MPB shall also deliberate on the recognition of the academic career of students who have already obtained a degree at this University or at other Italian Universities and who apply, upon enrolment, for the recognition of their educational credits, within the limits established by the Departmental Regulations for the recognition of university educational credits.

ARTICLE 17 – Committees

1. The MPB may establish temporary or standing Committees with preparatory and/or advisory functions, or with operational tasks delegated by the Board. These Committees shall formulate non-binding proposals to the MPB.

ARTICLE 18 – Master’s Programme Board

1. The MPB in International Relations and Organisations is composed of the instructors responsible for the course units included in the Academic Offer and student representatives, as provided for by the University Academic Regulations. The list of Board members is updated annually.

ARTICLE 19 – Transitional and final provisions

1. Regulations, and any subsequent amendments, are approved by the Department Board following a proposal by the MPB.
2. The provisions contained in these Regulations apply to students enrolled in the Master’s Degree Programme in International Relations and Organisations starting from the 2025/2026 academic year, and their validity is guaranteed for a period of at least the standard duration of the Programme. The Department further reserves the right to amend the Regulations even before the conclusion of the academic cycle, based on particular requirements.
3. In the event of amendments to the Academic Regulations, students enrolled in previous academic years are granted the option to opt into the new Regulations.

4. Any matters concerning the interpretation or application of these Regulations shall be resolved by the Department Director *pro tempore*.
